PUBLIC COMMENTS

Janet Bailey – 1336 Fairway

- Voiced concerns of cars parking in the middle of Bush Street by Hardscrabble.
- There is a tree on her neighbor's property growing into her chimney she is worried about. The house is in foreclosure. She asked how much of a clearance around the chimney there should be, around the propane tank – what is defensible space?

REGULAR MEETING

1. WATER MASTER PLAN CONTRACT APPROVAL

MOTION by Council Member Neuman, seconded by Council Member Raggio and carried 4-0-1 AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH NOLTE VERTICAL FIVE (N/V/5) FOR PREPARATION OF THE ANGELS CAMP WATER MASTER PLAN

2. PUBLIC HEARING: WASTEWATER MASTER PLAN

The City Administrator explained that in the absence of Terry Cox he would be presenting this item. He explained because partial funding of the Wastewater Master Plan was through CDBG monies, a hearing was required to obtain comments from the public. He requested anyone making a statement during the public hearing to sign the sign-in sheet provided at the podium. If there were any written comments they should be sent to City Hall.

3. ANGELS CREEK MASTER PLAN AND TRAIL WORKSHOP

Planning Director Dave Hanham presented a PowerPoint outlining the background of the Master Plan and Trail. He explained that this workshop was for information only and the Plan will be coming back to the City Council where there will be a public hearing before approval.

John Broeder: Angels Camp Resident
Spoke in favor of the Plan.

Richard Wilmhurst, Jr.: 855 Gold Cliff
Spoke against the Plan due to encroachment on private property.

Wes Kulm: 592 Springhouse Road
Spoke in favor of the plan.

Mr. Rolleri: 1331 Rolleri Bypass
Asked Mr. Hanham if a property owner does not want this on their property, would they have to have it? Mr. Hanham explained that they would not, but if the property was developed in the future, the plan would be made a part of the development.

Council Member Raggio said he has received negative responses on the plan from owners whose properties will be affected. He asked why the plan couldn't be changed now to remove these properties. The Council will discuss this issue and others when the Plan comes back to Council on May 15th for the Public Hearing.
