¹ Bicycle Detection Location Intersections are those road intersections where bicycle crossing lights (or other crossing signals) would be triggered with the assistance of bicycle detectors (i.e., detecting the approach or presence of bikes then stopping motorized traffic to allow for bikes to cross the intersection) much as demand-actuated traffic signals sense the presence of traffic before changing signal phases in order to optimize traffic flow.

Pedestrian Facilities

Proposed improvements in and around Angels Camp as identified in the *Calaveras County Pedestrian Master Plan (2007)* include:

- Installing continuous sidewalks on both sides of Highway 49 between Highway 4 north and Highway 4 south, including an extension on the west side of Highway 49 to the Longs shopping center (Frog Jump Plaza), with the exception of a short, constrained segment on the east side of the highway just north of downtown
- Upgrading all crosswalks on Highway 49 and the Murphys Grade Road crosswalk to high visibility, including new or repositioned advance warning signs and additional street lighting where not currently provided.
- Correcting the improperly positioned locations of push buttons and pedestrian signal heads at the intersection of Highway 49 and Highway 4 (north)
- Installing a new high visibility school crosswalk of Highway 4 (south) at Angels Creek Community Day School. Mid-block location should include advance warning signs, concrete landing areas with curb ramps at either end of the crosswalk and possibly additional street lighting and a flashing pedestrian crosswalk beacon.

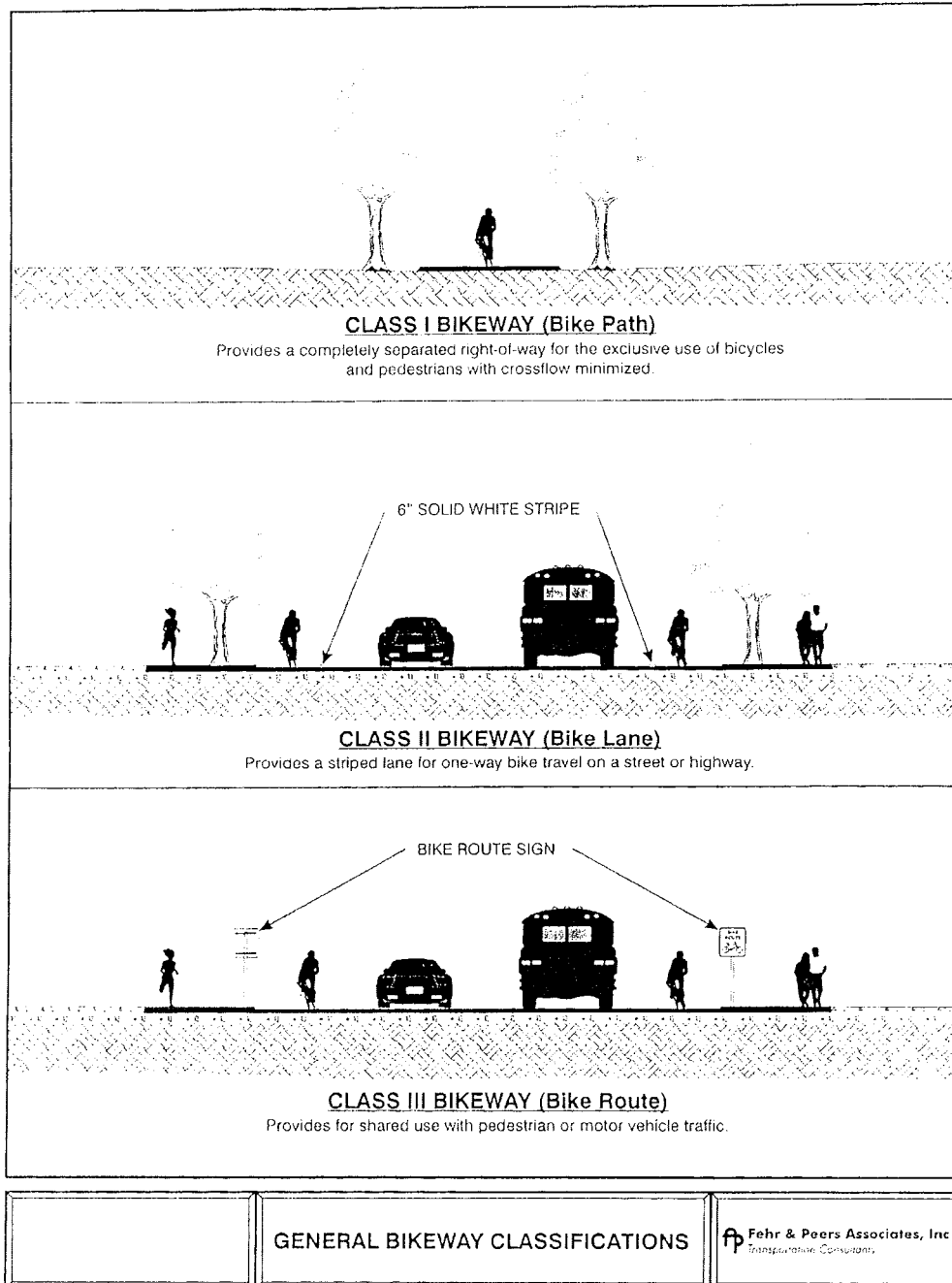

Standards for Construction Low-Impact Modes of Transportation Facilities

Note: Circulation Element (Chapter 3), Implementation Program 3.B.d and Park and Recreation Element (Chapter 12), Implementation Program 12.B.d provide guidance for applying the following criteria to individual facilities.

The following standards, based on bikeway design only, may be revised over time. Check for current design standards in the Caltrans Highway Design Manual (Chapter 1000) online at: www.dot.ca.gov/hq/oppd/hdm/pdf/chp1000.pdf

Class I Facility

Facilities with exclusive right-of-way with cross flows by motorists minimized. Chapter 1000 of the California Highway Design Manual defines Class I bikeways as serving the exclusive use of bicycles and pedestrians.

Class II Facility

Provides a restricted right-of-way designated for the exclusive or semi-exclusive use of low-impact modes of transportation with through travel by motor vehicles or pedestrians prohibited, but with vehicle parking and cross flows by pedestrians and motorists permitted.

Class III Facility

Provides a right-of-way designated by signs or permanent markings and shared with pedestrians or motorists. Local plans sometimes adopt a policy that this facility class not be used.
